A Meditation from Elbert Russell - August 1, 2024

#### THE BETTER SACRIFICE

If therefore thou art offering thy gift at the altar and there rememberest that thy brother hath aught against thee, leave there thy gift..., first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.

Matthew 5:23-24. (Read also Luke 17:1-4, Colossians 3:12-17)

The Old Testament prophets insist that God desires righteousness or mercy or goodness rather than sacrifice (Isaiah 1:13-17, Hosea 6:6, Micah 6:6-8). Jesus goes beyond mere justice or mercy and insists on brotherhood. To him reconciliation is more important than any of the forms of worship. God's forgiveness is conditioned on men's practice of that virtue; therefore he taught his disciples to pray, "Forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors". The love of God and his worship cannot be separated from the love of men: the commandment to love God has a second like it, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself".

Different peoples and different times have made different things central in religion and even in Christianity. Some make ritual central in it and some, creeds. Some find the essence of it chiefly in a future millennium or in the next life. But Jesus puts the chief emphasis on the practice of brotherhood in this life.

One of the most common and persistent tendencies in organized religion is to substitute rites and ceremonies or the saying of creeds or the keeping of commandments for justice, mercy and brotherhood. Certain types of men want "the consolations of religion without the restraints of piety". They want a worship that is emotionally and esthetically satisfying without moral requirements. In a word, they want a worship that will make them feel good without the necessity of being good. Jesus teaches that this cannot happen in *Christian* worship.

Beyond the memory of him who gives.


#### **Excerpt:**

## They Have Either Bought or Borrowed The Virtues

What do you expect conversion to be? Quitting drinking, swearing, lying, Sabbath breaking, evil speaking, tattling, laziness, anger, vanity, pride? Commencing to be sober, speak the truth and pure words, church going, kindness to others, industry, gentleness, simplicity, unselfishness, humility? Yes? No?

"If I had here some pine cones, acorns, chestnuts, walnuts, peaches, apples, oranges, grass wheat, oats, turnips, carrots, and I said to you, 'Look at my beautiful forests, see my tall pine trees, my majestic oak, my green chestnut tree, my spreading walnut trees'— if I said, 'Look here at my orchards, my peach, apple, and orange trees'—if I pointed to the grass wheat, oats, turnips, and carrots and said, 'Look at my farms, there is my

pasture, here is my wheat field and next to [it] my field of oats, just over there are my two fields of turnips and carrots'—you would say to me, 'Friend, these are the products of such forests, trees, and fields, but you may have all these fruits and yet own none of the fields. Perhaps you have only bought or borrowed them.'



"And that is pretty much the fact with many people who have quit or seemed to quit the worst sins, and seem to have some of the virtues. They have either bought or borrowed the virtues—bought them with hard exertions to overcome their temptations, or borrowed them by trying to wear the fruits of the tree of life. No, I tell [you], to be converted is not simply having the fruits of a good life, and it never is without having them."










#### **FUM Will Host Book Study Group**

This fall, Friends United Meeting will host conversations based on the book *How to Know a Person: The Art of Seeing Others Deeply and Being Deeply Seen*, by David Brooks.

David Brooks writes: The real act of, say, building a friendship or creating community involves performing a series of small, concrete social actions well: disagreeing without poisoning the relationship; revealing vulnerability at the appropriate pace; being a good listener; knowing how to end a conversation gracefully; knowing how to ask for and offer forgiveness; knowing how to let someone down without breaking their heart; knowing how to sit with someone who is suffering; knowing how to host a gathering where everyone feels embraced; knowing how to see things from another's point of view.

Brooks's list of social actions recalls the familiar verse from Galatians 5:22-23, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law."


