Musings from Parker J. Palmer - November 1, 2024

Appalachian Autumn

No, I'm not as old as the hills that rise around me as I rest amid the tawny grasses of this holler. But here in late October of my eighty-fifth year, they feel like age-mates to me. The greens of spring and summer are long-gone from the trees. Leaves of crimson, burnt umber and amber flare against the darkening sky, defying with beauty the soon-to-end cycle, one more round of life and love in this longtime landscape of suffering.

The ancient earth takes it all in, indifferent and compassionate in the same breath. This is how I want to live, my failings and lost opportunities forgiven as they are under this sun released in their triviality, resurrected as new lifeen route to dying with thanks and praise and no mind-begotten regrets.

Every year, when autumn comes around, I remember a poem I wrote years ago during an afternoon of musing-and-dozing amid the tall grasses of a Kentucky holler. It captures a moment I don't want to forget.

Everything I saw and felt during that afternoon is part of the landscape of our lives—the suffering and the loving, the dying and the being born, the darkness and the light. And every bit of it plays a role in the making of a soul.

We live in perilous, high-stakes times when it's easy to be whiplashed between hope and despair. But nature can teach us a lot about embracing complexity in a way that allows us to see life steadily and see it whole.

That's the kind of wholeness I seek, and that's what I wish for you and yours. Whatever our differences may be, we are traveling together thru what Keats called this "vale of soulmaking." Wouldn't it be grand if we could remember that, in the end, we are all just walking each other home?






