### **Excerpt:** Friends of the Kingdom

"In a seminary where I once taught, a student had been assigned to a large and affluent suburban church as a ministry intern, and he was discouraged. The church seemed to him to be rich and complacent, indifferent to the needs of society, and more concerned about matters like the décor of the bride's parlor than the plight of the poor in the city. Hearing



the student complain loudly about his situation, a mentor at the seminary gave him some wise counsel. 'Go back to this congregation,' he advised, 'and look for friends of the kingdom.'

"So he did, and gradually he found them, Christians in that church who were concerned about the needy, ready to serve as people of compassion and as healers for a broken world.

"Not long ago, I spoke with a man whose wife died suddenly and unexpectedly of a heart attack. 'The first few days were the roughest,' he told me. 'Everything in our home spoke her name and reminded me that she was gone.'

"The day after his wife died, the man's doorbell rang. It was a neighbor, a man whom he barely knew, standing on the step and holding a paper bag. 'I am so sorry to hear about the loss of your wife,' the neighbor said. Pointing to the bag, he added, 'I have some hot soup, two bowls, and some spoons. May I split this with you?' The two of them sat at the table, and shared chicken soup and comfort in the midst of grief.

"Because Christ is alive and at work in the world, they are out there—down the street, in every neighborhood and church, in every place far and near—friends of the kingdom, everywhere."






