A Meditation from Arthur J. Mekeel - March 1, 2023

REFLECTING CHIRST'S LOVE AMONG MEN

Whoever says, "I am in the light," and yet hates his brother, is still in darkness. Whoever loves his brother is always in the light and puts no hindrance in anyone's way.

—1 John 2:9-10 (Read Matthew 5:21-26)

In days of hate and destruction, one of the chief witnesses of the Christian life is reflecting God's love for all his children. It was not only said of the early Friends, "Look how the Quakers love and take care of one another," but more than that, "They did not only refuse to be avenged for injuries done them, and condemned it as an un-Christian spirit, but they did freely forgive, yea, help and relieve those who had been cruel to them, when it was in their power to have been even with them ..."

The desire to "get even" is one of the most difficult impulses to master. In fact, it cannot be mastered. We will cease to have such an attitude only when our lives so reflect God's love that we just do not have feelings of revenge. Does a mother desire to "get even" with her child who has wronged her? No, she only sorrows that the child could have done such a thing, and she tries to love it out of that condition of mind. Love like that of Jesus for men who crucified him and like that of a mother for her child who has injured her comes only when we have submerged our self-love in the light and fellowship of Christ.

Excerpt: ...give thanks for daily gifts

"Thankfulness works in the Christian community as it usually does in the Christian life. Only those who give thanks for little things receive the great things as well. We prevent God from giving us the great spiritual gifts prepared for us because we do not give thanks for daily gifts. We think that we should not be satisfied with the small measure of spiritual knowledge, experience, and love that has been given to us, and that we must be constantly seeking the great gifts. Then we complain that we lack the deep certainty, the strong faith, and the rich experiences that God has given to other Christians, and we consider these complaints to be pious. We pray for the big things and forget to give thanks for the small (and yet really not so small!) gifts we receive daily. How can God entrust great things to those who will not gratefully receive the little things from God's hand? If we do not give thanks daily for the Christian community in which we have been placed, even when there are no great experiences, no noticeable riches, but much weakness, difficulty, and little faith—and if, on the contrary, we only keep complaining to God

that everything is so miserable and so insignificant and does not at all live up to our expectations—then we hinder God from letting our community grow according to the measure and riches that are there for us all in Jesus Christ."


